Third parties interested in reproducing parts or the totality of the data text and charts downloaded from www.eurospace.org or obtained from Eurospace shall contact Pierre Lionnet at Eurospace to seek the appropriate authorisations.

These authorisations will be granted for free in most cases (particularly for normal rights to quote, for academic work, for scientific publications, etc.), but in other cases (e.g. contracted work, use by consultancies, commercial publications etc.) the authorisations will be submitted to the payment of a fee to be negotiated with Eurospace.

APPLYING FOR AUTHORISATIONS

To speed up any request, you should include the following information in your request to Eurospace (please send to pierre.lionnet@eurospace.org):

- A full description of the work you wish to use:
 - An exact description of the content you wish to include. (Including any title, version, illustrations/images/diagrams, chapter/section/page numbers, start and end points of the extract required, etc.)
- How the work will be used:
 - Will it be adapted, or re-written, or reinterpreted?
 - If it will be changed in any way, give specific details of the changes, and assurances that the work will not be used to mislead, slander, or bring Eurospace into disrepute. It is best to include a copy of your work with the Eurospace data/text/chart in context.
 - Will it be included within other content, and if so what is the overall context, and what proportion of the overall work does the copied content represent.
 - An estimated number of units you expect to sell, (if applicable), and the time scale over which you expect to sell them.
 - How will the work be reproduced, (i.e. published in book format, released online, etc.)
- Give assurances that the work will be properly attributed.

Please include full contact details of the person wishing to use the work, (or agent if applicable), to ensure that you can be contacted in case of any questions.
